

DANGER FOOTBALL SCHEDULE & UPDATE



The Indoor Football League has announced the schedule for the 2016 football season. The Danger will begin their season by hosting the Wichita Falls Nighthawks on February 27th. The schedule now consists of eight home games and eight away games to accommodate the two new teams this year, the Spokane Shock and Minnesota Havok. Two teams also rebranded themselves. The Colorado Ice changed their name to the Colorado Crush, while the Bemidji Axemen became the Minnesota Axemen. The Danger have signed 10 new players to the 2016 roster, including two former Huskers. Brion Carnes returns to the team after being signed near the end of the 2015 season. Thomas Mayo was also a late pick up for the Danger last season and will be returning this spring. The rest of the signees will be new faces for the Danger, including Corey Cooper, a former All-Big Ten selection for the Huskers at safety. Jameel Sewell, Danger Quarterback and 2015 IFL MVP, will also be returning for the 2016 season.
